

SCUTTLEBUGS' IMMUNIZATION & ILLNESS POLICY

Immunizations: Effective 10/31/2022, ScuttleBugs Boulder does not enroll unvaccinated children.

Illness: Certain symptoms in children may suggest the presence of a communicable disease. Children who have the following symptoms should be excluded from the child care setting until:

1. A physician has certified they symptoms are not associated with an infectious agent or they are no longer a threat to the health of other children at the center, or
2. The child has been fever-free for 24 hours without medication, 24 hours after vomiting has stopped, 24 hours after the last loose stool and/or 24 hours after treatment begins

IF YOUR CHILD DEVELOPS:	THE KEEP HIM/HER HOME UNTIL:
FEVER - A temperature of 100.04 Fahrenheit auxiliary or higher, before fever reducing medication is given	The fever is normal for 24 hours without fever reducing medication
RESPIRATORY SYMPTOMS - Difficult or rapid breathing or severe coughing that is constant and prevents the child from participating in activities	Coughing, breathing difficulties and/or other symptoms no longer affect normal activity
VOMITTING	24 hours after vomiting has stopped
DIARRHEA - 2 or more abnormally loose stools in the previous 24 hours. Observe child for other symptoms	24 hours after the last loose stool
RASH OR SKIN PROBLEMS	Rash disappears or is diagnosed as not contagious. IMPETIGO - 24 hours after treatment begins and lesions are dry or can be covered by bandages SCABIES - 24 hours after treatment begins CHICKEN POX - until blisters have dried into scabs, about 6-10 days after onset THRUSH —24 hours after treatment begins HAND FOOT & MOUTH - 24 hours after treatment begins and lesions are completely dry.
CONJUNCTIVITIS (PINKEYE) - Tears, redness of eyelid lining, irritation followed by swelling and discharge of pus	24 hours after treatment begins
NITS & HEAD LICE	First treatment is completed, no live lice are seen and ALL nits (eggs) are removed
STREP THROAT/SCARLET FEVER	24 hours after treatment begins AND child is without fever
GENERAL LETHARGY - When a child is not able to participate in activities with reasonable comfort and requires more care than the program staff can provide without compromising the health and safety of other children	Condition improves
